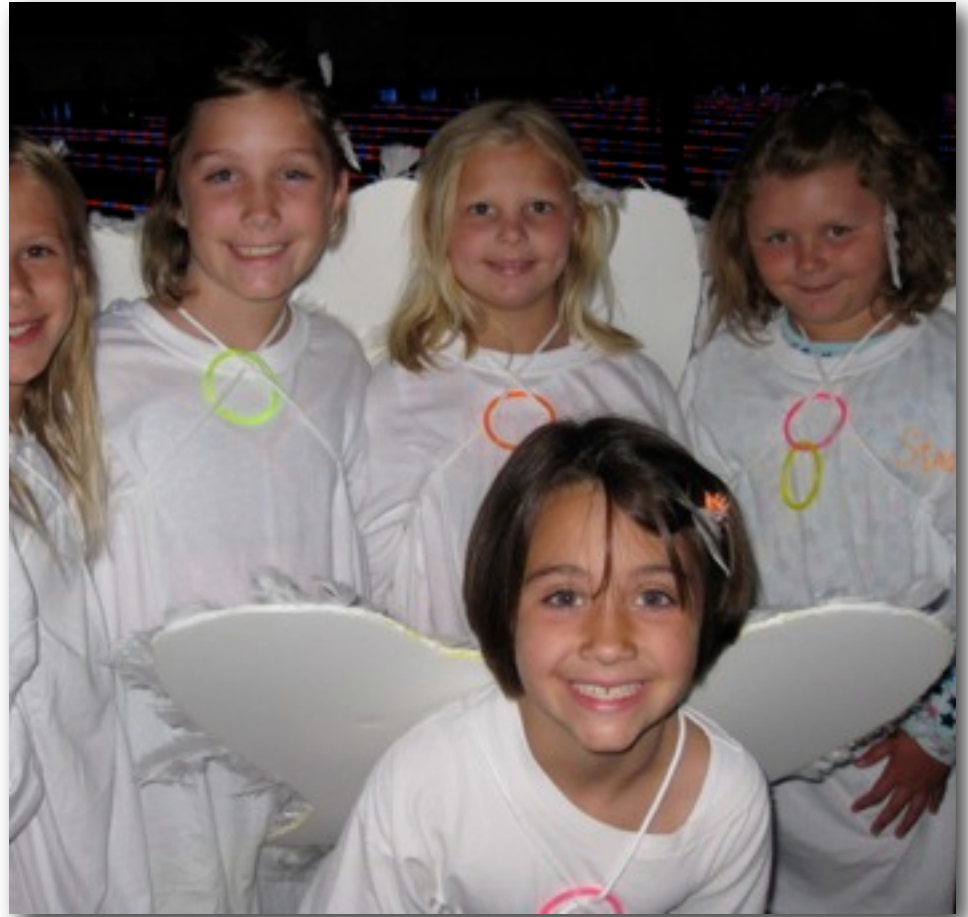

A LETTER FROM OUR FOUNDER



In the last year and half Angels on Patrol has accomplished amazing things. I am a "do-er" (big surprise) and sometimes I felt we were proceeding at a snail's pace. However, looking back and talking with others about non-profit organizations getting off the ground, I believe we have a lot to be proud of and that we have proceeded much faster than at a 'snail's pace.'

Why did I start Angels on Patrol? First of all, let me tell that there is no way I could have

achieved all the things I've done by myself. One of the main reasons that Angels on Patrol exists is because Arizona Foundation for Women (AFW) heard my dream, believed in the dream and in me, and helped get Angels on Patrol off the ground. AFW continues to let Angels on Patrol operate as a donor advised fund of their organization. My heartfelt appreciation goes out to AFW and their board.

In 2003 I met three amazing boys through my work with the police department. The two boys, twins, at five years of age, had been essentially caged like animals since birth. Their elder brother of 3 years shared their room and was led to believe that this sort of treatment was acceptable and normal. I have been blessed to be able to remain in contact with the boys and their adoptive family throughout the years. Their adoptive family has experienced financial hardship over the years for a variety of reasons, the main factor, as many other families have also experienced, is the economy. Considering what these boys have gone through, I want the world for them and have reached out to family and friends each Christmas to assist.

I wanted to start a non-profit so that others might be willing to give to the cause of helping police officers help those they serve that are in need. It never hurts that donations to a non-profit is a tax exemption. After consulting with AFW and putting together some incredible people for a board, Angels on Patrol was formed. Our mission, as I am sure you already know, is to help abused or neglected children, or families in financial hardship identified by Phoenix Police Officers. Our dream is that Angels on Patrol will be valley wide someday, maybe even bigger.

On June 12th, 2010 we had our first big fundraiser. Angelica Delgadillo and Niki Harris kindly donated their time to organize our successful Bowling Bonanza. It was successful because so many people came forward to help us fill the lanes at the bowling alley and purchased raffle items; this led to the gross receipt of approximately \$6000! Organizations that were represented at this fundraiser were the

Girl Scouts of Arizona (Cactus Pine Council), AIM-IT Services, NAWIC (National Association of Women in Construction), Cactus Wren Republican Women, SEEDS, Cox Communications, ATR (Arizona Trail Riders), and others.

In addition to the fundraiser, wonderful people have contributed money and in-kind donations along the way. There is no such thing as a donation too small and we've appreciated every cent that every donor has provided to Angels on Patrol. This means that all these donors believe in the board's dream, in my dream. As of September 2010, between fundraisers and donations, Angels on Patrol raised over \$19,000!

Organizations like the John F. Long Foundation, Suns Charities, and Soroptimist International of Phoenix have provided Angels on Patrol with grant funds. We've had individual donors contribute money. We've had organizations that have contributed in-kind donations like back packs with school supplies, miscellaneous items that families in need can use, and AIM-IT Services has donated their time in establishing and maintaining our website.

Everything that everyone has done to assist Angels on Patrol has been humbling and I/we appreciate each and every one of you.

What have we done so far to accomplish our mission? We have received 7 Family Application Forms from officers that we have funded. The requests included helping a mother purchase school clothes for her child who had been kidnapped for two years; purchasing financially strained grandparents who have custody of their 3 grandkids a 6 month membership at the YMCA so that the grandkids can participate in programs there; helping an aunt who obtained custody of her nieces/nephews with small items that she could not afford; purchasing a 16 year old girl trying to stay out of trouble a 6 month membership to the YMCA to utilize their programs to stay busy; and several others.

We have only been accepting Family Application Forms since about July and we are excited to see the police officers become involved by submitting the forms. To the officers reading this, please help us get the word out and please keep an eye out for instances where Angels on Patrol can help a family in need.

Thank you for believing in Angels on Patrol. I hope you continue to grow with us, as a friend of Angels on Patrol. I cannot tell you enough how humbling it has been to have all of you believe in my dream. Again, thank you.
